## Aid For Kagoshima Fire Sufferers Urged

Brother Zeno Zebrowski, a well-known Christian missionary and director of welfare for orphans and the poor at the Conventual St. Franciscan Fathers, Tokyo, Thursday urged Japanese citizens and foreign residents in Japan to join a nationwide relief campaign for Kagoshima people, who suffered one of the largest fires in recent years in Kyushu, the southernmost island of Japan, early this month.

Over 720 houses were razed, and about 2,700 citizens rendered homeless, in the disaster on October 2. Brother Zeno, who just returned from an inspection tour at Kagoshima City, Thursday said that the situation was "far more worse than expected or reported."

Brother Zeno also added that any kind of relief items, including monetary donations, are now being received at his Conventual of St. Franciscan Fathers, Nishigahara, Kita-ku, Tokyo, and at the Kagoshima City Office, Kagoshima City, Kyushu.
